

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Danial Kushairi



Danial Kushairi was diagnosed with autism at the age of two and was nonverbal until three years of age. Similar to most people on the autism spectrum, Danial has trouble communicating and making other people understand him. Growing up, he had limited language capabilities, and he was in his own world most of the time.

At 16, he discovered his talent in drawing and painting through therapy sessions and school activities. Today, he still struggles with communicating and expressing his emotions but is able to express himself better through art.

The Art with Heart returning artist has been active in the arts scene since 2019, and he hasn't stopped since. Danial's **Sparks of Change** moment came

when a local art gallery invited him for the first time to participate in a group exhibition, and he was the only neurodivergent artist. It was at that moment he realised that his talents are being recognised.

Besides his keenness on drawing musical instruments, Danial also loves using vibrant colours and feels very connected to nature, as portrayed by his paintings. Most of his works are inspired by his surroundings, including family, gardens, flowers and plants, and animals. With a unique neurological influence of his visual perceptions, interpretations, and high imagination, Danial also embeds the element of naivety in his paintings.

In his latest project, with the collaboration of a writer and the direction by his mother, his inspirations are expanded into children's story books, including *Mr. Turtle to the Rescue* (2021) and *Ben Saves the Day* (2022).

Azriq Anwar's artistic journey began when he was a student at Taylor's University, where he started drawing objects by experimenting with as many mediums as possible.

In an ever-changing world, Azriq's art stands as a reflection of his inner growth. It mirrors his journey through life's intricate tapestry, capturing the essence of the human experience. With unwavering determination, he continued to shape his craft, which led to his **Sparks of Change** moment where he devised a specific structure to produce his artwork. Another moment took place in 2022 where he took on the role as a Creative Director and reflected his passion for art in the full-length music video for a new local band, Abjad Aksara, which was produced under Luncai Emas, a prestigious recording label in Malaysia owned by Datuk M. Nasir.

The path he treads is not without challenges. Like any other artist, Azriq has faced moments of doubt and creative drought. Yet, there hurdles have become stepping stones that pushed him to explore new horizons. He believes that every obstacle carries a hidden opportunity, a chance to evolve and redefine his artistic boundaries.

Azriq enjoys reminiscing about memories, dreaming about the future, interacting with people, and appreciating ordinary things in life.

Delwin Cheah



Delwin Cheah was diagnosed with Asperger's Syndrome at the age of five. Despite his condition, he possesses exceptional artistic abilities and has made valuable contributions to his community and nation through his art.

At the age of eight, Delwin's talent caught the attention of Dr. Rosa Martinez, the President of Strokes of Genius in New York, a world-renowned organisation that collects artwork from savants worldwide. Delwin's unique skills also brought him to the attention of One East Museum founder, Mr. Ch'ng Huck Theng, who helped him with his first solo art exhibition. His exhibition, which featured over 70 paintings, earned him the title "Youngest Savant Artist to hold a Solo Art Exhibition," awarded by Record Setter USA,

and the "Youngest Artist (ASD) to hold Solo Art Exhibition," awarded by the Malaysia Book of Records.

His artwork received recognition and admiration by some of the most notable figures in the world, including Barack Obama and Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Delwin's artistic talents, coupled with his love for nature and endangered animals has led him to partner with WWF Malaysia to design a limited edition t-shirt featuring the Malayan Tiger, to raise funds and create awareness of the endangered animal.

In April 2017, Delwin was named the new Country ICON or "IKON Negaraku" by the Malaysian government as recognition for his artistic talents and his contributions to society.

His **Sparks of Change** moment as an artist unfolded during his recent art exhibition, titled *Freedom - Oxygen of the Soul*, where he sold all his artwork after only 20 minutes following the exhibition's launch.


Graceful Zebras

Wan Jamila



Wan Jamila, known professionally as artjamila®, is an award-winning savant artist known worldwide. She embarked on a journey within the art industry in 2017 with numerous live painting demonstrations and has won several live painting competitions on national and international platforms. Her journey as an artist began when she won the National Live Painting Competition titled 'NEGARAKU' organised by the National Art Gallery. Now, after seven dynamic years, she stands as a seasoned professional.

Her **Sparks of Change** happened in 2020, when the Viatalenta Foundation in Switzerland appointed her as an Impact Artist for sea pollution awareness. She was also featured in an Agence France-Presse article titled *Generation Z*:

creative and committed, against the virus in 2020. She was also chosen as a Gen.T Honouree Asian Leader of Tomorrow in 2021 and awarded the ICON Anak Istimewa Selangor ("AnIS") by the State Government of Selangor in 2022.

Within the same year, she was represented by a prestigious mainstream gallery in Europe and her works were displayed in four countries. She hosted her first grand solo exhibition, titled *Voyage of Moments*, organised by Galeri Shah Alam in collaboration with Creative Media Hub Universiti Teknologi MARA Shah Alam from 29 March 2022 to 15 April 2022.

Throughout her career as an artist, she has participated in two grand solo exhibitions, eight mini-solo exhibitions, 12 group exhibitions internationally, and 56 group exhibitions at a national level together with other well-known professional artists. The theme of diversity remains her driving force, reflecting a world where individuals from all walks of life coexist harmoniously.


Voyage Of Freedom Series 6 (A04A)

During World War II, the Japanese invaded Malaya. In 1946 the country sought independence from Britain and formed the United Malay National Organisation (UMNO). Under the leadership of Tunku Abdul Rahman, "Bapa Kemerdekaan", the Federation of Malaya gained independence in 1957. Sabah and Sarawak joined Malaya in 1963, followed by the establishment of Malaysia. Malaysia's Federal Territory comprised Kuala Lumpur, Labuan, and Putrajaya, formed in 1965.

Haziq faced difficulties in communicating at a very young age and he learned to express himself through art. Animals, especially of the feline family, are the main subject of his paintings. From as young as four years old, he was often asked to sketch animals, which he did in his own unique style.

Haziq's first painting was done on a whole wall of his kindergarten, which he named 'Friends'. After completing school, he worked for several years in a non-profit organisation, producing arts and crafts to be sold by the NGO. His sketches were incorporated in handmade cards, tags, decals, and for Christmas goodies.


He only began painting on canvas with acrylic paint at the age of 24, after an art teacher, who worked with differently abled persons, introduced him to a different aspect of the art world. Haziq draws inspiration from many things, including landscape, nature and sunsets, his favourite time of day, as subjects in his artwork. His latest collection, on the other hand, features musicians with musical instruments, inspired by his love of music.

He recalled his artistic journey reaching a turning point when he sold his painting for the first time. He attributes his creative growth to continuous exploration and unwavering support from his art teacher who nurtured his distinct style. Haziq's art has evolved into a vibrant narrative through patient brushstrokes and intricate detailing, reflecting his unique perspective and emotions.

Haziq's **Sparks of Change** arrived when he recognised the power of arts to eloquently convey his thoughts, circumventing the challenges of verbal expression. His motivation is further fuelled by the heartfelt appreciation his work garners, which brings him profound contentment.

Izzati Shahrin completed her formal education at a school in Shah Alam, Selangor, that is tailored for special needs students. Her journey as a self-taught artist began when her family noticed her talent and provided her with various art materials for her to explore with.

Her creative drive is nurtured by observing the evolving world around her, a palette of emotions expressed through strokes, hues and style, and reflected via an array of mediums. For Izzati, her **Sparks of Change** moment was when she rediscovered her creative expression by transitioning from direct interpretations of her observations to symbolic representations, while seeking an alternative form of inspiration during the COVID-19 lockdowns.

Amidst the pandemic's challenges, Izzati's artistic evolution took a bold stride forward as she explored the depths of her creativity and found solace in the world of symbolism, allowing her art to convey deeper meanings beyond the tangible. This shift marked a turning point, infusing her work with renewed purpose and connecting her more profoundly with both her craft and her audience.

Izzati's creations now feature a fusion of her unique perspective and the transformative spirit of change. As her artistic journey continues to unfold, she remains committed to embracing the unknown, translating her experiences into captivating visuals that stir the imagination.

Dhan Illiani Yusof is known as being part of Malaysia's National Women's Ice Hockey team. She is a multidisciplinary artist and a member of the Projek Rabak and KolmeGlu art collective. Dhan dabbles in conceptual contemporary art in various forms, such as film, paintings, installations, photography, poetry, clothing and performance art. She defines her **Sparks of Change** moment as an artist every time an idea comes to flourish into a piece of art that sparks a continued sense of joy and opens many possibilities.

Her works are primarily experimental, playful and interactive. She explores unexpected combinations of different forms and genres of interest to

reinvent and break boundaries. This is done through collaborative feats and interactive works that integrate art outside of its conventional understanding, while emphasising different ways that integrate and explore childlike play - the idea of play in the lens of an adult.

She has actively created content and experimented with her art form since high school, beginning her journey with illustrations, paintings using different mediums, and making small makeshift installations. Dhan often gets various requests and commissions from people to customise multiple items, including sneakers, apparel and tote bags. She is most notable for using herself as a canvas, and dubbed as "The Bucket Hat Girl" for her signature look with her bucket hat and long pinless shawls. Her distinctive style and manner of dressing mirrors her art form - unconventional, eccentric and a mix of her various interests.

She became involved in the local art scene after graduating from high school, taking a year off from higher education to pursue her passion and curiosity in art by joining a myriad of showcases, exhibitions and collaborating with artists and creatives. Dhan developed skills in fabric manipulation, embroidery and embellishments, designing apparel, photography, weaving and sewing when she enrolled in a Fashion Design Course at INTI International College. In addition, she does freelance where she works on murals, live paintings, fashion styling, and digital art commissions.

Gabriel Cheah Chee Fong or better known as Gabriel Cheah, is an emerging crystal sculptor and ceramic artist. Other than producing one-of-a-kind, hand -moulded and unique art pieces, he also experiments with acrylic, especially when working with a canvas. He is an active member of KolmeGlu art collective, and his works have gained attention from collectors abroad and locally since his debut in 2022.

He graduated from the Malaysian Institute of Art in Graphic Design and sharpened his hand-moulding techniques under the tutelage of his mentor,

Chao Harn Kae, who conducts workshops internationally from Malaysia to Hong Kong. Though sculpting is challenging and time-consuming, Gabriel found calmness and serenity when producing his hand-moulded sculptures, which he sometimes incorporates into his paintings.

Gabriel experimented with a myriad of art forms and mediums through his experience working in the local advertising industry, before coming to his **Sparks of Change** moment, where he discovered his true calling as a multidisciplinary artist.

Although his journey as a young artist had just begun, his interest in experimenting with different mediums evolved through the help of his mother, a highly-coveted seamstress, who encouraged and planted the seeds early on. At a very young age, Gabriel's mother exposed him to Austrian crystals, fabrics and materials, building his appreciation for high-quality materials over the years. He incorporated crystals in all his art pieces, from paintings to sculptures, which became his trademark. Gabriel believes the positive energy contained in crystals will help many feel and think positively. It is especially true for him as crystals come from mother nature. In many instances, Gabriel also treats himself as a canvas by integrating the crystals into his outfits as wearable art, which reflects his outgoing approach to life.






and has created many visually satisfying pieces of artwork.

Born in 1998, his early development was typical until he turned one, where his development slowed dramatically, and he started showing signs of hyperactivity. His parents brought him for assessments during his formative years, and he attended speech and occupational therapies. During his early primary school education, he was guided by a clinical psychologist, Dr. Lua, who worked with special needs children, helping him develop his language skills and basic social skills.

Despite his condition, Ken Ming has always had a passion for art, drawing from the moment he could hold a pencil properly. He attended art classes

from a young age and went to an Art College after completing his secondary education in IGCSE. He continued to pursue his passion for art, learning painting techniques from various teachers. With the support of his family, he now produces artworks on his own, some of which have been sold, with the proceeds going to various charities.

Ken Ming has been active as an artist for the past four years, and his **Sparks of Change** moment was when he felt the urge to explore new ways of expression and techniques. This pivotal juncture illuminated his artistic journey, propelling him to transcend boundaries and sculpt his own artistic identity.

Animals, whether extinct or fictional, fascinate Ken Ming, and this is evident in his work. Zoology, myths, and legends inspire him, and he weaves an intricate tapestry with each brushstroke on canvas, bearing the indelible imprint of his unique perspective and unquenchable curiosity. 




Sok Yeng's **Sparks of Change** as an artist came when she had the opportunity to showcase her artwork and was appreciated for her work.
